



COVID-19 DEATHS IN LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES

Although less than one percent of Americans live in long-term care facilities, the percentage of COVID-19 deaths from this population is far higher.¹ While this higher percentage is partly due to the elderly having the highest risk of dying of COVID-19, Congress should investigate why some states had a far higher percentage of their COVID-19 deaths concentrated in long-term care facilities compared to other states.²

The following chart shows the percentage of COVID-19 deaths in long-term care facilities compared to total deaths on a state-by-state basis.³
