

# **RPC Highlight**

H.R. 5107 - Common-Sense Law Enforcement and Accountability Now in (CLEAN) DC Act of 2025 Sponsored by Rep. Andrew Clyde (GA-09) RPC Region 6

## **Bill Summary:**

This legislation would repeal sections of the District of Columbia (D.C.) Council's Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Amendment Act of 2022.

# **Policy Background:**

The Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Amendment Act of 2022 placed restrictions on D.C. Metropolitan Police including limitations on restraints, lack of access to body-cam footage for incident reports, removal of all officers from the Police Complaints Board, and barriers to using riot gear and less-lethal projectiles.

In 2023, the House and Senate passed <u>H.J.Res. 42</u> disapproving the Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Amendment Act of 2022. President Biden vetoed this legislation and the House failed to overturn the veto.

### **Committee Action:**

This legislation received a <u>markup</u> and was reported favorably by the House Oversight and Reform Committee on September 10, 2025, by a vote of 26-19.

#### **Previous House Consideration:**

A similar resolution <u>passed</u> the House of Representatives on April 19, 2023, by a vote of 229-189.

## **Outside Group Support:**

This legislation is supported by the D.C. Police Union and the Fraternal Order of Police.
