

## **RPC Highlight**

H.R. 5140 - To lower the age at which a minor may be tried as an adult for certain criminal offenses in the District of Columbia to 14 years of age.

## **Bill Summary:**

This legislation lowers the age at which a minor may be charged as an adult in the District of Columbia from 16 to 14, with respect to certain criminal offenses committed after enactment of this legislation.

## **Policy Background:**

In 2024, juveniles accounted for <u>51.8%</u> of all robbery arrests and, as of August, 60% of all carjacking arrests in 2025. The percentage of homicides and non-fatal shootings by perpetrators ages 15-to-20 almost <u>doubled</u> from 2021 to 2024. According to MPD, <u>violent crime</u> <u>by juveniles</u> has gone up every year since 2020 and nearly 200 juveniles arrested in 2024 had prior violent crime arrests.

## **Committee Action:**

This legislation received a <u>markup</u> and was reported favorably by the House Oversight Committee on September 11, 2025, by a vote of 26-19.
